Alberta Innovates (AI) is conducting an evaluation of the nanoFAB as part of an overall review of AI Nanotechnology Programs. The AI Nanotechnology Program provides operational support to the University of Alberta's nanoFAB, as well as the University of Calgary's Microsystems Hub, the Cellulose Nanocrystals (CNC) Pilot Plant, and the Campus Alberta Small Business Engagement Program (CASBE).
